LEGAL LIABILITY INSURANCE

At a recent rally information session the matter of insurance cover in relation to your caravan was raised and discussed. I have examined a number of the leading insurers policies and set out details for your information. This cover applies to Comprehensive Insurance or Third Party Property Damage Covers.

What is caravan legal liability?

Caravan legal liability means that an Australian Court or other judicial body finds, or the insurer accepts in writing, that as a result of an accident, you, or a person using your caravan with your permission, is legally responsible to pay compensation for;

- Loss or damage to property owned or controlled by someone else, or
- The death or bodily injury to another person.

Insurers have different limits of liability (sum insured) on this section.

CIL give a legal liability cover of \$ 20,000,000 NRMA give a legal liability cover of \$ 20,000,000 GIO give a legal liability cover of \$ 10,000,000 on towed caravans

The cover is generally limited to Australian States and Territories and is in force when your caravan is being towed, stationary at a caravan park, free camp or indeed at your home address.

Personal Liability Insurance cover attaching to Home Contents.

Personal Liability covers the legal liability of you or your family (normally residing with you) for;

- Loss or damage to property owned or controlled by someone else, or
- The death or bodily injury to another person.
- In an incident that takes place away from your normal home site but within Australia

It excludes claims arising from using or owning a vehicle (except for a bicycle, mobility scooter, wheelchair, golf buggy, cart or remote controlled toy).

The limit any one incident is normally either \$ 10,000,000 or \$20,000,000. This cover includes legal costs when the insurer's lawyers handle any claim.

Remember: If you are involved in an incident do not admit liability without the approval of your insurers.

This information is not given as professional advice and if you require further information you should consult your insurers Product Disclosure Statement.

Whilst in Cobar recently we picked up a broucher for Billabourie Riverside Tourist Park on the Kidman Way just outside of Hillston...And as we were heading in that direction we decided to "Check It Out".

Billabourie is actually a working cattle and farming property owned by the Parr family, And they have set aside an area for us travellers who enjoy a nomadic lifestyle. The setup can best be described in one word as WOW. Billabourie Riverside Tourist Park is on the banks of the Lachlan river where you can drop in a line and hopefully you will catch a Murray Cod or a Yellow Belly...There are fire pits aplenty where your catch can go straight from the river to the pan YUMMY.

There is a brand new Amenities block inclusive of disabled facilities for those of you (and me) who need them. There are natural grassy powered sites and plenty of non powered campsites with firepits. There is an abundance of firewood around.

It is dog friendly but your dog must be kept on a lead at all times as the property is a working farm and there are working dogs in the area. To get there take the Kidman Way towards Cobar from Hillston and 36 kilometres out (just over the lachlan river} you will come to Mt Grace road on your right...Travel 12 Kilometres along Mt Grace road (good gravel road) where you will come to the Billabourie homestead.

After opening and then closing the gate proceed a short way till you come to the camping area (adjacent to the homestead) where there are instructions as to what you have to do then.

I recommend this campsite to you all out there and I hope you enjoy your stay there as we did. Barry & Lee

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Home Made Ricotta (so easy and delicious) Ingredients:

- 2 Litres full cream milk
- 1 cup fresh cream (in cardboard container)
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons fresh lemon juice

Method:

Line a sieve with cheesecloth or a clean chucks cloth and place over a bowl.

In a large, heavy pot over moderate heat, bring the milk, cream and salt to a boil, stirring constantly to prevent scorching. Add the lemon juice, reduce the heat to low and continue stirring until curds form, about 3 minutes.

Pour the mixture into the lined sieve and let drain, about 10 minutes. Remove the ricotta from the sieve to a medium bowl, discarding the liquid; allow to cool in refrigerator before using.

42) If you've washed and dried a tube of lipstick with a load of laundry, saturate the lipstick spots with WD-40 and presto the lipstick is gone!

43) If you spray WD-40 on the distributor cap, it will displace the moisture and allow the car to start.
