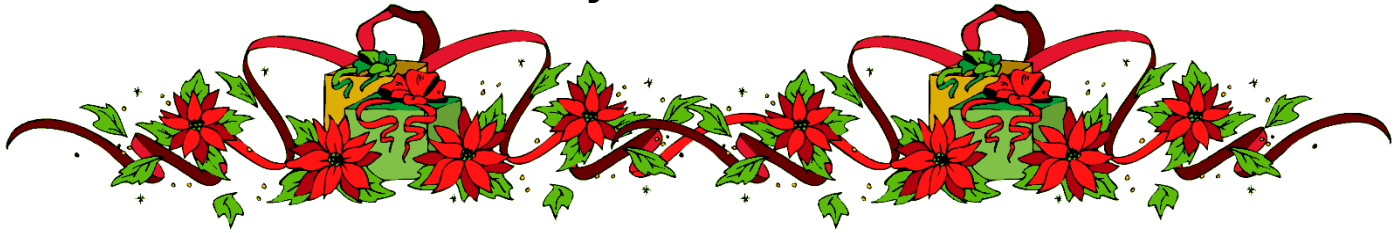

Stop 1

Paddy's Creek Rest Area.
