VALE JOHN DAVID SPENCER AM CGStJ

It is with sadness that we note the passing of our long serving member John Spencer who passed away on 10th February 2021 after a long illness.

John and his wife Tricia joined Jayco NSW in 2004 and have been very active members of our club for many years. John was responsible for drafting our Jayco Club Constitution and looked after the many changes throughout the years. John was a great reference point for questions regarding constitutional matters as well as Association information. He organised many tag-alongs including the first ever to Casino and this is still mentioned by members as a memorable time.

John was our club delegate to the NSW Association of Caravan Clubs until he accepted the positions of Association Secretary in May 2010 and then as President in August 2014 until he stepped down in November 2018. He was responsible for the organisation of many successful State Caravan Rallies and attended a number of National Caravan Rallies.

Apart from his caravanning, John was Honorary Secretary and Board Member of Sydney Legacy which he joined in 1970 and gave over 50 years service. John was President of St. John's NSW and held many other positions. He was a member of St. John's for over 71 years (1949–2021). On Friday 26 June 2020, John received the St John's Ultra Long Service Medal with 3 Bars, in recognition of his service to St John Ambulance Australia and the Order of St John. He was the first Australian member of St John to receive this gold award, the Ultra Long Service Medal of the Order is awarded to eligible persons after 50 years of continuous and qualifying service to St John.

He planned and worked for 10 long years in setting up the Spectator First Aid Centre for all visiting nationalities and received an AM (Member of the Order of Australia) for his contribution to the 2000 Sydney Olympics and Paralympics. John also worked many days at the Invictus Games. As you can imagine, John was always giving his time to many charities, clubs and Associations.

Many people got to know and work with John and we are sure that all of us came to respect and admire his commitment and helpful nature as we did.

John will be greatly missed by his wife Tricia, his sons Darren and Craig and many friends from the Jayco Club.
